Sugar Bush Knolls Residents,

Due to the upcoming solar eclipse, the Village Council has taken a preventative measure to ensure the safety of the residents. A Resolution was adopted that bans parking on Village streets starting on April 7th at 8:00 am until midnight on April 8th. However, there is a clause that allows for parking passes for residents and their guests as well as any service contractors that may be working on these dates. If you wish to have a watch party at your residence, we certainly want to encourage people to do so. We just ask that you follow current parking requirements. This would include, but is not limited to, parking on one side of the roadway at a time and not obstructing any driveways. Parking passes may be obtained from the Mayor, Jeff Coffee or Clerk/Treasurer, Amy Mucha. Vehicles that are in violation on the dates listed above may be towed at the mayor's discretion. We hope this does not have to be exercised. Our concerns are as follows; residents being able to access their homes without interruption, emergency vehicles being able to access residents in an emergency, and lastly, avoiding damage to property.

The Governor's office has estimated that several million people may come into the state to view the eclipse. Our Village is in the direct path of the eclipse, because of this, we want to make sure that our Village remains safe during this event. The Resolution for the temporary parking restriction is posted on the Village website for review. Thank you for your patience and understanding. Hopefully we have a sunny day so we can all view this historic event without any emergencies or issues.
